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# School Priorities 2017 - 18

## Curriculum Developments



### Read Write Inc Phonics

*We are now coming to the end of our second year and phonics teaching is having a positive impact on reading standards.*

### My Book Blog

*As soon as pupils complete the read write inc scheme they begin to use 'My Book Blog'. This is an online portal that allows pupils to develop comprehension skills across KS2.*

### Maths - Reasoning Skills

*There has been a focus on teaching reasoning lessons this year. Pupils also access RM Easimaths at home and at school.*

### Use of QR Codes in Science

*Teachers have received training on how to create QR codes containing photo/ video evidence to support pupil assessments.*

### Raising the Profile of Welsh

*Our newly established 'Criw Cymraeg' have met regularly this year. The 'Helpwr Heddiw' system has been re-established. Each school site has a Welsh display and each classroom has a Welsh working wall!*

### Target Setting Procedures

*Our procedures are becoming more refined. Teachers meet with senior staff every term to discuss progress and plan support for their pupils.*

### Developing a Creative Curriculum

*We have been involved in several pilot projects this year including Creative Arts Wales and Mantle of the Expert projects. Both projects focus on creativity within the curriculum.*

### PSE - School sport and health

*Ysgol Y Waun has achieved 'Healthy Schools Gold Status' in recognition of our commitment to promoting school sport and health!*

## IMPROVEMENTS TO OUR BUILT ENVIRONMENT

- Our Y1 and Y2 classrooms have had new classroom doors fitted during the spring term.
- Our conference room at Lloyds Lane has been refurbished - in preparation for September - when it will be used as an additional classroom.
- The head teacher's office at Chapel Lane is now used as a multi-purpose work space for school staff to use.
- New activity trails have been installed on both school sites.
- The Lloyds Lane car park has undergone renovation - for use by school and Freedom Leisure.






## STAFF CHANGES 2017/ 18


This year we have seen several changes to our staffing structure:

## REPORT ON SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS 2017/ 18

My name is Natalie Edwards and I am the school special educational needs coordinator.

I have supported Ysgol Y Waun in this capacity for 8 years.

In 2017/ 18 there are 76 pupils on our school special educational needs register.

The needs of pupils vary from school action (57 pupils) to school action plus (14 pupils) and statement of educational needs (5 pupils).

I work closely with many different supporting agencies including the behaviour support team, educational psychology service, primary steps and CAMHS.

As part of my role I ensure that the school SEN policy works effectively to support parents and pupils. I last updated the policy in February 2018.

I have also organised several training events for teachers and parents this year including ADHD Awareness sessions provided by Alan Roberts.

The effective support that we are able to provide for SEN pupils is a result of our careful allocation of school resources - ensuring that all of our pupils make good progress over time.

Should you have any concerns regarding your child's education then please contact school to make an appointment to meet with myself and/ or our SEN link governor, Mrs Glenys Jones.

### Destination of School Leavers - 2018

Y6 pupils will travel to many different secondary schools this year.

Historically we have sent almost all of our pupils to Ysgol Dinas Bran.

In recent years we have noticed a changing trend where more parents are choosing to send their children to St Martins School in St Martins and other destinations including The Marches School in Oswestry. Over half of our pupils still travel to Dinas Bran in Llangollen, Denbighshire. Some pupils have also chosen to transfer to Ysgol Rhiwabon - our nearest Wrexham secondary school provider.

*The transition process is very similar for all of the above schools and visit days are arranged as part of our agreed transition arrangements with each school.*
