CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENTS

- Additional books (£2000) have been purchased to support guided reading/ book blogging. A further 30 Chrome books have also been purchased to support book blogging.
- All staff in years 3 and 4 have used TT Rock Stars and assertive mentoring materials to support their daily numeracy lessons.
- Y5 and Y6 staff have used QR codes, video clips and images to support the assessment of science. See Saw evidence has also been used for the moderation of our science books.
- All staff have worked hard on improving standards in Welsh across the school, two teaching assistants have attended Welsh sabbaticals and Mrs Hughes has supported Welsh teaching in years 5 and 6.
- Preparation for the new national curriculum 2022 is well underway, staff have attended update sessions and are now considering/providing feedback on the draft guidance documents.
- We have Significantly improved access to audio visual equipment/ ICT equipment at Chapel Lane with new AV screens in every classroom and replacement computers/ laptops in every classroom.
- All staff have received First Aid and Safeguarding Training this year.




Staff Changes

Dear Parents,

My name is Mrs Edwards and I am the schools 'Additional Learning Needs

I am responsible for the implementation of the new ALN code of practice and work with pupils, school staff and parents to ensure that all pupils' needs are met fully.

As part of my role I attend ALNCO forum meetings, once every term, to receive updates from Wrexham. I also meet regularly with other ALNCO's working in our area.

I provide training for staff and arrange training opportunities for parents including ADHD/ Autism awareness sessions provided by Alan Roberts.

This year we have developed our own unique resource provision at Lloyds Lane which has enabled us to provide support for a wider group of pupils.

We are also providing a new spelling programme for ALN pupils called 'Nessy'. This has been very successful at addressing particular needs.

By working together we can ensure that all pupils achieve their potential!
